**The Fort Frye Community**

Spanning 165 square miles, in the North Central part of Washington County and Center Township of Morgan County, Ohio, Fort Frye Local School District serves the educational needs of the villages of Beverly, Lowell, Lower Salem, and the surrounding rural areas. This geographical area is recognized as a part of Appalachia; many of our students are first generation college attendees. The impact of the continuing global economic downturn is evidenced by the free and reduced percentage of our student body reaching above 48.7%. Industry, agriculture, construction, and tourism comprise the economic base. Despite the economic struggles the community faces, our students attained 95.3% attendance district wide (2018) and a graduation rate of 98.7%. Our student population is 98.4% Caucasian.
