Fort Frye High School Scheduling Card 8th Grade Class of 2025

Traditional Classes

Every student will be enrolled for a full year of High School Physical Education, Language Arts 8, General Science 8, Math 8, Social Studies 8, and additional periods for Reading Workshop 8 and Math Skills 8. Students designated as Talented and Gifted will be serviced in each of the core courses as appropriate for that student. All 8th grade students will have a rotations period consisting of a nine weeks of computer skills, careers, health, and art. The last period of the day for all students will be WIN (What I Need). It is more than a study hall---extra help, make up work, etc. Students are encouraged to take a high school elective of Agriculture Education or Fine Arts.

Advanced Math Class

Students will be placed in advanced classes based on several factors such as, but not limited to, teacher recommendation(s), AIR score(s), iReady score(s), attendance, behavior, and grades. The high school principal may consult with teachers, counselors, and elementary principals about eligibility, but he/she will be the final authority as to placement.

Every student will be enrolled for a full year of High School Physical Education, Language Arts 8, General Science 8, Algebra I, Social Studies 8, and an additional period for Reading Workshop 8. Students designated as Talented and Gifted will be serviced in each of the core courses as appropriate for that student. All 8th grade students will have a rotations period consisting of a nine weeks of computer skills, careers, health, and art. The last period of the day for all students will be WIN (What I Need). It is more than a study hall---extra help, make up work, etc. Since advanced math students do not have the extra math skills class, they will be placed in a study hall or are highly encouraged to take a high school elective of Agriculture Education or Fine Arts.

Special Needs/Inclusion Classes

Students identified with specific reading, writing, or mathematics goals will be placed in the least restrictive environment possible with intervention support. Inclusion classrooms have been created for all four core content areas---language arts and reading, mathematics, science, and social studies. Junior High resource classrooms have been created for both language arts and mathematics. Assignment to inclusion or resource classrooms will be determined by the student's Individual Education Program (IEP) or 504 Plan.

Every student will be enrolled for a full year of High School Physical Education, Junior High Resource Room/Inclusion Language Arts 8, General Science 8, Math 8, Social Studies 8, and additional periods for Reading Workshop 8 and Math Skills 8. Students designated as Talented and Gifted will be serviced in each of the core courses as appropriate for that student. All 8th grade students will have a rotations period consisting of a nine weeks of computer skills, careers, health, and art. The last period of the day for all students will be WIN (What I Need). It is more than a study hall---extra help, make up work, etc. Students are encouraged to take a high school elective of Agriculture Education or Fine Arts.

Optional Electives and High School Credit Classes

High School credit courses include Agriculture Education, Algebra 1, Geometry, Art 1, Concert Band, Concert Choir, and HS Physical Education. These courses are taught by a high school certified instructor and are courses offered for grades 7-12. **High School credit will be granted for this course. This will be one of the first grades recorded on the student's transcript and will follow him/her through graduation.**
