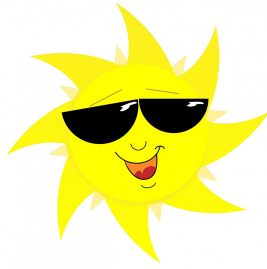

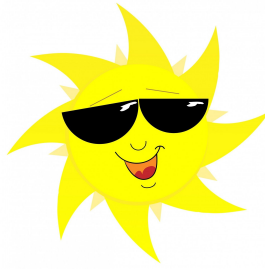
- Six-week programs: June 23-August 7, 2018
- Three-week session 1: June 23-July 14, 2018
- Three-week session 2: July 15-August 4, 2018
- Two-week Robotics program (non-credit): June 30-July 14, 2018

*Because the majority of the programs fill to capacity before the deadline, it is to your advantage to apply as early as possible. Sign up for the [e-mail list](#) to be notified when the system is opened. Online applications open in mid January. Online applications are available in January; most applications will be due April 29.*

### **Program charges include:**

- **Academic fees**, which include:
  - Either tuition for enrollment in regular Cornell University undergraduate credit-bearing courses (two classes of up to eight credits for six weeks of study and one class of three to four credits for three weeks of study), OR academic fees for enrollment in the non-credit Robotics program,
  - most course-specific fees, and
  - an official Cornell University transcript.
- **Residential service fees**, which include:
  - the cost of accommodations in a Cornell residence hall supervised by residential community advisors,
  - a full meal plan,
  - access to student life and safety services, and
  - participation in learning activities, academic skills workshops, admissions workshops, one-on-one admissions counseling sessions, and a wide range of social activities.

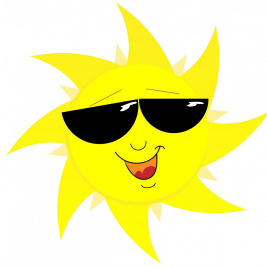
### **Summer College students living within the U.S.:**

*You are required to pay either the \$100 summer Student Health Fee or enroll in Cornell's Student Health Plan (SHP).*

### **Students living outside the U.S.:**

*You are required to enroll in Cornell's Student Health Plan (SHP) for the length of your program.*

## Summer Programs 2018

*Full payment is due within five business days from the date of your acceptance letter, however, if you are admitted within a week before or at the application deadline, full payment is due the day of your acceptance. Students are NOT enrolled in their classes or assigned housing until the total program charge is paid in full. See [payment methods](#).*

**Summer College offers a limited number of partial scholarships that are awarded based on:**

- *a family's demonstrated financial need,*
- *a student's academic achievement and promise, and*
- *the availability of funds.*

*Scholarships are reserved for credit-bearing programs and thus not available for the non-credit Robotics program.*

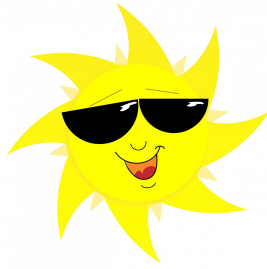
**You'll be considered for all financial aid scholarships for which you are eligible only:**

- *after we have received all of your [completed admissions materials](#),*
- *after we have received all of your financial aid materials (see section below), and*
- *if you've been accepted into the program.*

*We must receive complete applications no later than April 7 (March 10 for RABS applicants). Please allow for adequate mailing time to make these deadlines. Financial aid decisions will be made no later than April 7 for RABS applicants, mid-May for applicants to the Architecture program, and April 28 for all other applicants.*

**Required financial aid materials include:**

- a completed and signed [financial aid application](#),
- a copy of a filed and signed 2016 or 2017 tax return with W-2s and schedules, or
- a copy of 2016 or 2017 income statement if tax returns are not filed.



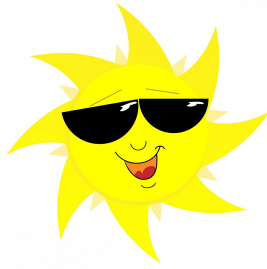

***2-week courses: June 17 - July 1, 2018***

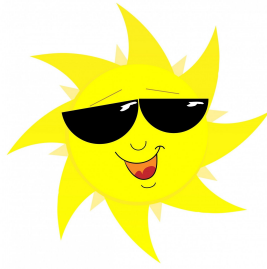
***4-week courses: June 17 - July 14, 2018***

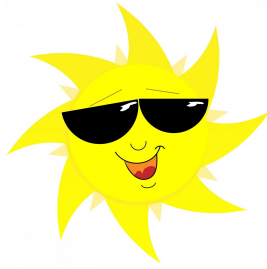

### Cancellation and Refunds

All cancellation requests must be made in writing. Application fees or deposits are **non-refundable**. Any tuition paid to the university will be refunded if processed before the university withdrawal date. The university will not refund tuition, room & board, or any other program fees for Summer Programs students dismissed from the program or unable to enter the country due to an improper visa.

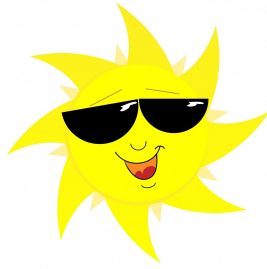

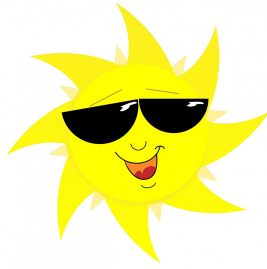

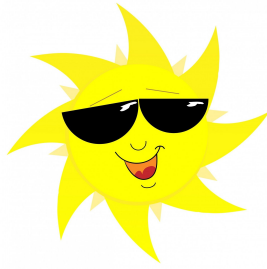

### ***Cancellations and Refunds:***

All cancellation requests must be made in writing. The cancellation and refund policy of the 2018 Summer College for High School Students program is as follows:

- **Before May 9, 2018:** refund of 100% of the program fee, less the \$500 deposit which is forfeited.
- **May 9 - May 23, 2018:** refund of 75% of the program fee, less the \$500 deposit fee which is forfeited.



## Summer Programs 2018

- **May 24 - June 6, 2018:** refund of 50% of the program fee, less the \$500 deposit fee which is forfeited.
- **Beginning June 7, 2018 and thereafter:** No refund.

The deposit is taken from the refund amount after calculating the refund percentage of the program fee. **ALL** cancellations involve the forfeit of the \$500 deposit fee.

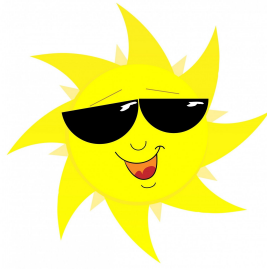
**The Jonathan R. Reynolds Young Writers Workshop is an eight - day residential summer program in creative writing for current high school sophomores and juniors who love to write. The workshop is for students who are passionate about writing and eager to connect to a community of writing friends. A week at Denison offers a great introduction to the liberal arts college experience. This offer is for current sophomores and juniors only. The program welcomes all current sophomores and juniors from all backgrounds and experience levels. At the Reynolds Young Writers Workshop, beginning writers of poetry, fiction, and creative nonfiction get the chance to develop their talents and hone their skills. Aspiring high school writers receive one-on-one interaction with writers from *The New Yorker*, *The Atlantic*, and *SB Nation*.**

#### ***Session Description***

At the Reynolds Young Writers Workshop, we meet daily in small morning and afternoon workshops (limited to 12 students per group). In addition, sessions led by visiting writers, individual conferences, and structured writing time further enhance your skills.

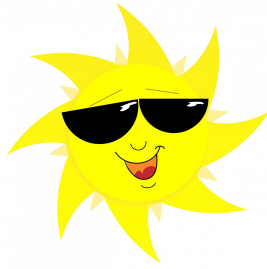

PreCollege programs provide high school students with an invaluable opportunity to sharpen their portfolios through rigorous college-level art, design, and creative-thinking courses that are modeled after Pratt Institute's undergraduate offerings. Each summer, Pratt Institute's PreCollege program welcomes nearly 400 high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors to our Brooklyn campus for nearly one month, where they encounter life as an art and design college student.

### **Why Should You Attend?**

- Explore the possibility of studying art, design, architecture, creative writing, or cultural studies.
- Confirm that this is the subject you want to study in college.
- Develop your skills through college-level coursework, and earn 4 college credits.

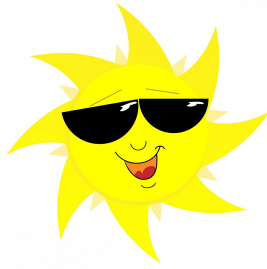
Application fee - \$50

Deadline - March 1; applications for scholarships will not be accepted after this date. Late applications are accepted on a space - available basis.

### ***Important dates***

December 2017 - application process begins

April 6 - required form due with \$500 deposit

April 20 - I-20 request form due for international students

May 11 - Full payment of tuition and fees due. A \$100 late fee will be added to any payments received after May 15.

### ***Tuition and Fees***

Tuition - \$3,839 (four classes, four elective college credits)

Application fee - \$50 (nonrefundable, due with application)

Deposit - \$500 (nonrefundable, applied to tuition)

Student activities fee - \$395

Transportation - \$121.50 (for residential students only, estimated cost for 30-day unlimited MetroCard)

On-Campus Housing - \$1,025

Meal Plan Residence - \$820 (mandatory and for Brooklyn residential students only)

Meal Plan Commuter - \$215 (optional and includes lunch, only for commuter students)

The prices above do not cover materials or cost of health insurance. Pratt Institute requires all PreCollege students to have their own health insurance. Tuition and fees are subject to change.

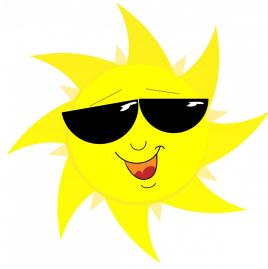
### ***Scholarships***

Students applying for a merit scholarship will need to express their interest on the application and upload two samples of artwork (medium of their choice) and two letters of recommendation. Merit scholarship applicants are reviewed based on their overall application submission on a competitive basis.

- Before June 1st - full refund on payments made (minus the application and deposit fee)
- Between June 1st and June 15th - 50% refund on payments made (minus the application and deposit fee)
- As of June 15th - no refund for any reason
